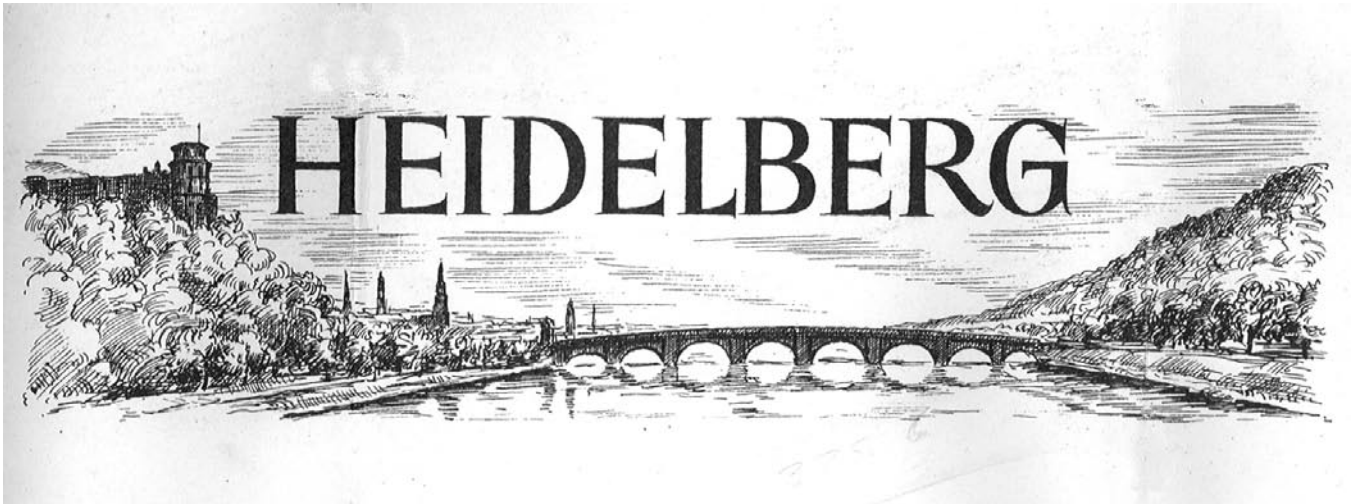


Image of the castle and the old bridge looking downriver, from a 1952 map, sent by John Hogan '65

**All-Years Reunion in Heidelberg, July 19-21, 2011**

**MARK YOUR CALENDARS!!** Registration is now open for the 2011 Summer Reunion, to be held July 19-22, 2011 in Heidelberg. We hope to see you there! Please use the following link to get details and to register: <http://heidelberghighschool.com/2011reunion>.

For those without access to the wonderful world of the internet, registration forms are appended as the **last two pages** of this issue.

The dates have changed a bit from those announced in our last issue. The castle will unfortunately not be available for our dinner dance, but the festivities include registration at HHS in Mark Twain Village (then "Little America", later "MTV") July 19 and a picnic at Patrick Henry Village (later known as "PHV") July 20. These US facilities are now behind walls and fences, and **passport numbers are required for clearance to the school and Patrick Henry**. We will cruise up and down the Neckar river July 21, and we close with a dinner dance at the Stadthalle, also on July 21.

A block of 20 rooms under "Heidelberg Reunion" has been reserved at the Crowne Plaza Heidelberg for the Early Years at € 109 single and € 129 double, which includes breakfast. The Plaza has on-site parking at € 19 per day, hourly shuttle to the Frankfurt Airport, and air conditioning. Germany has had several hot summers lately, so A/C is important. The Crowne Plaza is on the Kurfürsten-Anlage, about 200 yards from Bismarckplatz, near where the old Bahnhof was. ## HEIDELBERG EARLY YEARS REUNION: August 26-29 in Reston, Virginia

The **class of '55** celebrated its **55<sup>th</sup>** – its “golden-year, double-nickel, double-nickel reunion” – and had the most members at the reunion, with 12. The **class of '60** celebrated its **50<sup>th</sup>** and had the next most members present, with 10. The earliest class represented was **1952**.

**Judie Rhea Wiley '55** brought beautiful prom photos from HHS days, made from slides taken by her father, a professional photographer. **Anne Smith Atherton '55** has already made reservations for the all-years reunion in Heidelberg in July 2011. **Anne's** twin **Ellie Smith Fox '55** has visited nine more countries since she last checked in with the newsletter, for a total (so far) of **142!**

**Dave Murphy '53** came the farthest, from Turkey. **Marshall Winokur '60** got stuck in Washington traffic (there was a demonstration on the Mall) that turned his 9-hour drive from New Hampshire into a 12-hour ordeal, but he had a good time once he got to the reunion. **Luke Williams '58, Willie Brucker '59, and Bob Flowers '65** all wore their letter jackets, which still fit just fine.

The Heidelberg hospitality suite, as always the heart of the reunion, was large, comfortable, and very well stocked with nibbles and drinks, posters, scrapbooks and other HHS memorabilia through the years, and sofas, tables and chairs where we could enjoy all these things with each other. It was a super hangout.

On the Saturday tour to the Sunset Hills Winery and the Udvar-Hazy Air and Space Museum, local resident and history buff **Joe Keating '55** entertained us with stories of places seen from the bus windows as we drove through the Virginia countryside. The winery is centered around a huge old barn, restored beautifully by Amish craftsmen. The wines were beautiful, too. The Udvar-Hazy is big enough to hold the space shuttle Enterprise, the Concorde, the Enola Gay, and hundreds of other aircraft, ranging from the earliest attempts at powered flight to late-20<sup>th</sup>-century ultralights. The docents, often veteran fliers themselves, enliven their talks with their own experiences.

At the closing dinner dance, music from the 1950s, especially, brought out the couples to the floor. Three **1960** classmates, **Sandi Campagna Draude, Erika Herbster King, and Mike Abell**, danced one number together, laughing the whole time and ending with a kick line as their finale. **Linda Rose** (her husband is **Charlie Rose '61**) danced “Staying Alive” – solo, with verve and humor, and to perfection.

Thanks to **Bob Hines '54** and **Luke Williams '58** for planning the reunion, **Lynda Kangas Flowers '65** for choosing the menus, and **Bob Hines, Luke Williams and Sally Irwin Williams '59** for setting up and manning the terrific hospitality suite.
